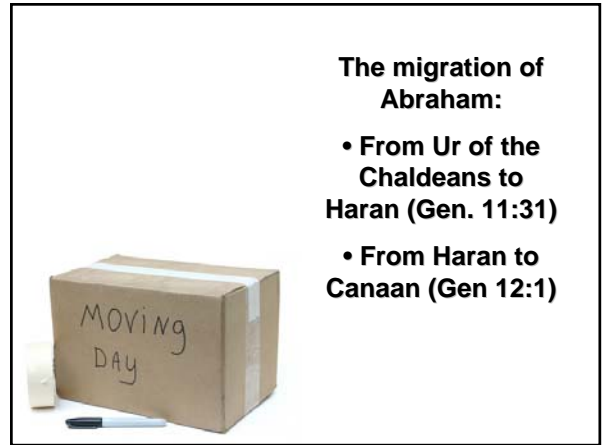
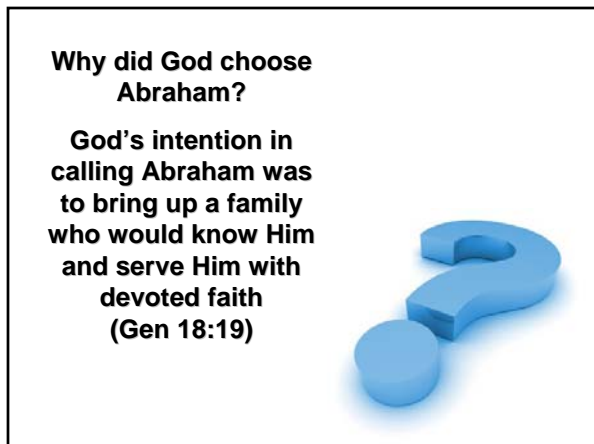

 - Friend of God

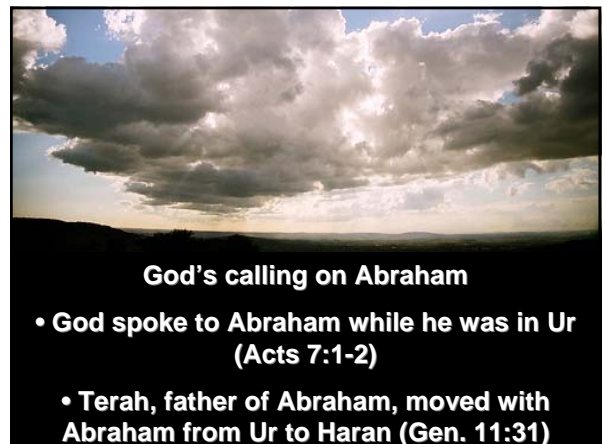


- The migration of Abraham:
- From Ur of the Chaldeans to Haran (Gen. 11:31)
 - From Haran to Canaan (Gen 12:1)




Why did God choose Abraham?

God's intention in calling Abraham was to bring up a family who would know Him and serve Him with devoted faith (Gen 18:19)



- God's calling on Abraham**
- God spoke to Abraham while he was in Ur (Acts 7:1-2)
 - Terah, father of Abraham, moved with Abraham from Ur to Haran (Gen. 11:31)




The promises to Abraham were conditional (Gen. 12:1):

He had to leave his own country and go to a land that God would show him.



The 1st lesson to learn from Abraham's call:

Abraham's call required him to separate himself from his country, his people, and his household. We too should separate ourselves from this world so that God's purpose in our life can be fulfilled.



The 2nd lesson to learn from Abraham's call:

God required obedience from Abraham. Obedience proves that our belief is genuine. God's promises can only be fulfilled if we are obedient to God.


Promises to Abraham:

- God promised Abraham a land (Gen. 12:1)
- Not only an earthly land but also a heavenly land (Heb. 11:9-10)



Promises to Abraham (12:2) :

- Abraham's family will become a great nation
- God will bring blessings in Abraham's life
- Abraham will be a blessing to people



Promises to Abraham (12:3)

- God will bless those who bless Abraham and God will curse those who curse Abraham
- All the people on the earth will be blessed through Abraham
